

Objectives:

To guide and encourage farmers about supplementary businesses

The context:

The Yeola region is basically a dry region and has been affected by drought for many years. The farmers tend to cultivate mainly onions and corn, which are not cash crops. They often suffer due to less rain and a volatile market. It has been observed that, apart from the limitations of the region, the farmers are thrown into misery due to a lack of information about government schemes, the tendency to introduce new crops, the practise of market oriented farming or organic farming, or supplementary businesses. Lack of financial management, is also one of the major causes of farmer depression. The institute aims to address such issues by spreading awareness among farmers through best practises.

The practice

• The departments of Economics and Commerce execute the planning and management of the programme. The departments organise programmes to reach out to the farmers of Vadgaon Ballehe. The farmers are informed about various government schemes and facilities. They are encouraged to think about other cash-crop options or start organic farming. They are given lessons in financial management, such as raising funds or accessing loans. They are taught about side businesses such as goat farming, dairying, and fishing.



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

Programme on Agribusiness Entrepreneurship

15.08.2021

On 15 August 2021, MGV's Arts and Commerce College, Yeola organised a programme on Agribusiness Entrepreneurship. The purpose of the programme was to boost organic farming. Mr Sadhubhau Shelke, an expert in organic farming and recipient of the prestigious Krishi Bhushan Award, emphasized the importance of youth becoming entrepreneurs in the field of organic farming, agribusiness, and agricultural product processing.

Mr Shelke delivered a keynote speech as part of a special lecture organized by the Women's Grievance Redressal Committee on the occasion of International Youth Day at Mahatma Gandhi Vidyamandir's Arts and Commerce College, Yeola. The event was presided over by Principal Dr Bhausaheb Game in a jovial atmosphere. Mr Shelke shared insights gained from studying crop production and agriculture practices mentioned in Vedas and Ayurveda, which have helped increase agricultural income.

The expert suggested that self-marketing of organically grown produce, packed in attractive packaging, can lead to higher profits. Obtaining trademarks and quality certifications, such as Agmark, can further enhance the value of the products. Mr Shelke encouraged youth to establish subsidiary industries and become entrepreneurs in the agricultural sector. He cited examples of successful agribusinesses, such as caste flour and wood oil, which have gained popularity among film actors and celebrities. Mr Shelke also advised the youth not to feel ashamed of any kind of work or salesmanship.

Reflecting on his own experience, Mr Shelke shared that his financial situation has significantly improved through these practices.

Principal Dr Game highlighted the importance of perseverance, dedication, and dignified labour for the youth, urging them to explore opportunities in organic farming. The event was attended by Vice Principal Shivaji Gaikwad, Senior Supervisor Arun Vanarse, and Junior Supervisor Prof. Sonawane.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the event was conducted online via Google Meet. Technical assistance was provided by Dr Gautam Kolte, and the introduction was delivered by Manisha Gaikwad, Head of the Women's Grievance Redressal Committee. 
